

Pajama-Burned Youngster Sues

A \$2.5 million damage suit was filed in Federal court here yesterday as a result of injuries received by 6-year old David Weisz, in 1970 when his pajamas caught fire in his suburban Havertown home.

Arnold E. Cohen, the attorney who filed the suit on behalf of David and his parents, Joseph and Lois Weisz, of 9 Castle Rock drive, said the boy was playing with a cigaret lighter when his pajamas were ignited and burned rapidly.

DAVID HAS LOST the use of both legs as a result of his injuries, Cohen said. Named as defendants in the complaint were Tom and Jerry Boys' Wear, Inc., identified as manufacturer of the pajamas, and M. Lowenstein & Sons, Inc., which allegedly manufactured the fabric used in the garment. The firms are located in New York.
